Whether you have just bought your first Mac, or have been operating computers for many years, SAAUC has something to offer you. Members' collective wealth of information is always given generously.

SAAUC provides the following to members:

AppleSauce: the Club's monthly magazine presents advice, information and interesting articles from members and others from Australia and overseas

Library: members can borrow books and discs covering a wide range of system and applications software, as well as general information

Software updates: Two Club machines have the latest updates for OS X and other software. Members can transfer these to flash drives for installation on their own machines. This service can avoid long download times, especially for people using dial-up Internet access, and the machines are present at all Club meetings.

Discussion board: SAAUC has an online discussion board through which members can ask questions, make comments, offer advice, and solve members' problems. This facility is valued by city, country, interstate and overseas members. The Club also has an iVisit chat room.

Friday evening meetings

The Club invites various experts to present information on specific Mac-related topics. Members also come together in small groups, with our more proficient members explaining and demonstrating. Topics covered include:
