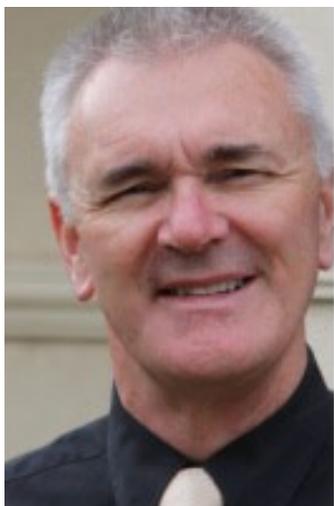

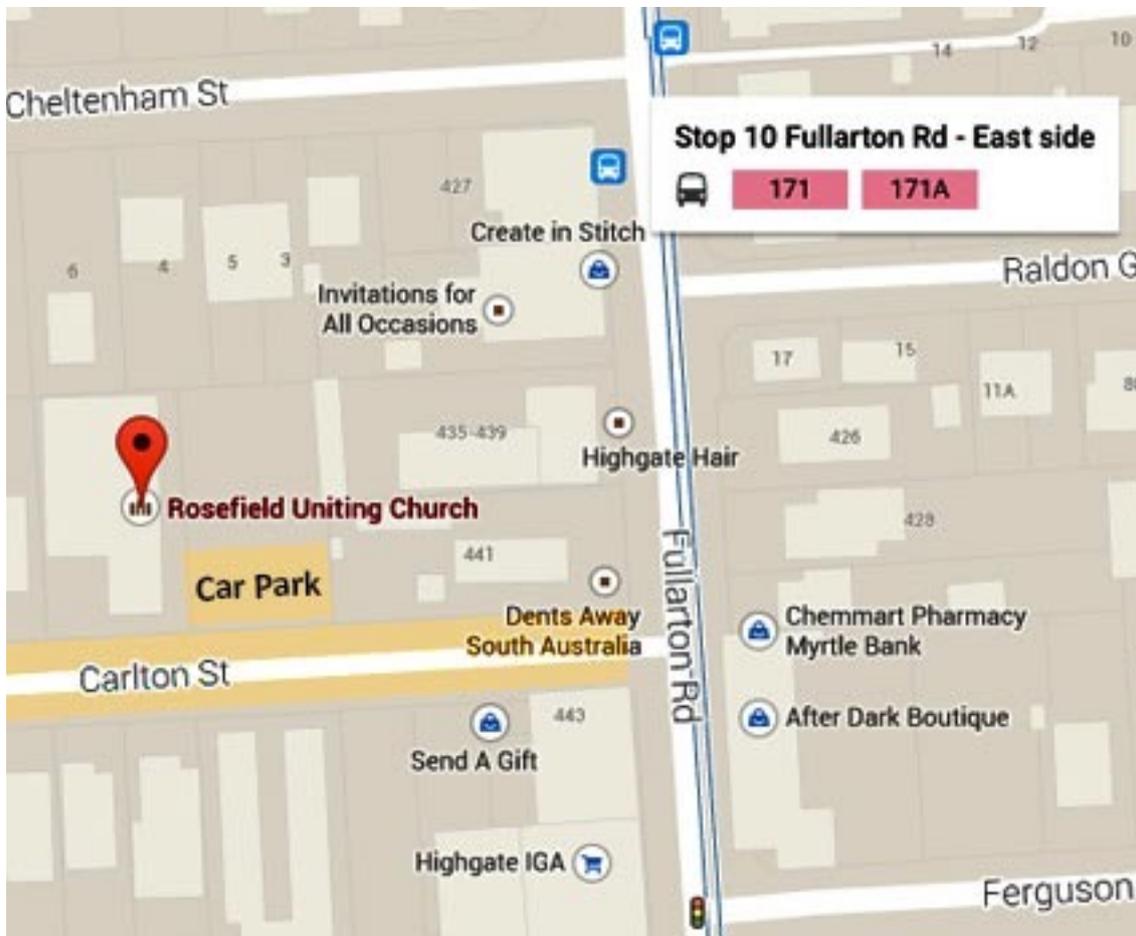

## Driving an Apple TV 4

I offered a “Few Thoughts” on the new Apple TV box in the January issue of *SAAUCery*. I can now drive one—a 32 GB unit found its way into my Christmas stocking.

I mentioned in January that Apple has removed the optical audio port from the ATV4, which I had relied on with my old ATV2. By swapping connections between the ATV4 and my DVD player, I was able to get video and audio with just the HDMI cable on the ATV4.

The ATV4 comes with just a few apps—*Settings* and a few Apple ones related to the ATV App Store: Music, Movies, Computers (on the same Wi-Fi network, for “pulling up” music or photos on such a computer when *iTunes/Home Sharing* is active on it), etc. You then stock your new ATV4 with other apps, some free, some at cost. The Canadian App Store has a lot a of games and apps for major North American sports leagues, as well as for several “streaming” services (*Netflix*, of course!), a good many of which “cost”. These did not interest me, so I looked for “freebies”. *YouTube* was a given:-). *CBC News* gave me CBC news items and other public service shows; the *NFB* app gives me access to hundreds of excellent documentaries made by the *National Film Board of Canada*.

Apps for *The Weather Network* and *TripAdvisor* are useful, too. (I haven't "Got" any games, so I can't tell you what the new Remote is like as a game-controller.)

Apple makes much of being able to "Search" using *Siri* on the ATV4's new-style Remote. Yes, you can certainly ask Siri to do many things, but ... right now most of them are only on Apple things; few (if any?) third-party apps have Siri-compliant searching programmed in. I can "*Run YouTube, Siri*", but She cannot "*Play 'God save The Queen'*" once I'm in YouTube. But She can "*Play a James Bond movie, Siri*" if said movie is in the iTunes Movie catalogue!

Searching using the Remote can be tedious—you scroll across the screen!—but luckily the latest version of the *Remote* app on your iDevice **can** control the ATV4; it allows you to type in search words using the iDevice's keyboard.

For now, the range of offerings in the Canadian App Store is rather sparse, but (I hope) it will get better over time. The Australian App Store may be little better—even barer(\*)? As I said in January, if local TV networks create apps that let me play shows that have recently broadcast, I could pull them straight up onto my TV, instead of having to "AirPlay" them via my iPad. This would please me a lot!

So, for now, I'm doing little more than what I did using my old ATV2, but I believe in the potential of the ATV4:-).

(\*) From *TidBITS*:

*Most Apple TV coverage has been U.S.-centric, but Sarah Hendrica Bickerton offers her perspective on the Apple TV as a New Zealander, and it's not a sunny one. Bickerton reports that Siri and iTunes TV shows are not available, and even iTunes movie releases lag weeks behind the rest of the world. While Netflix is finally available in New Zealand, it doesn't even offer the Netflix original series "House of Cards" due to muddy distribution rights. Despite all of that, Bickerton is bullish on the new Apple TV due to tvOS and its associated App Store. Her article is a welcome reminder of how technology often isn't evenly distributed around the world.*

Erasing a DVD-RW with Disk Utility in El Capitan:

I couldn't! That is ... erase a Rewritable DVD (DVD-RW) using Disk Utility under El Capitan. I've been able to do it with Disk Utility since the dawn of OS X, but this seems like a "deletion of function", like no longer being able to *Repair Disk Permissions* (another change Apple made to Disk Utility in El Cap). In the end, I was able to erase the DVD-RW ... on our other Mac running Snow Leopard! ( I would build up the digital photos I took during the year, Event by Event, on a DVD-RW, then burn them onto a DVD-R at the New Year. The DVD-RW has to be erased each time I burn all the images year-to-date onto it.)

My Current Favourite Phishing Messages:

I've had a slew of phishing messages all through January. They all say I need to verify that "this Account belongs to you", and to sign "in using your Apple ID and password" by "clicking on the link below".

Hovering my cursor over said link showed it to be bogus (each one was different!). What made these messages endearing was their subject "Apple ID", and their greeting "Dears,":-).

(Please be assured that all these messages landed in my Junk Mail immediately upon arrival ...)

### Apple AC Wall Plug Adapter Exchange Program

Apple are replacing power adapters sold between 2003 and 2015 due to a design fault that could make them dangerous.

The problem is with adaptors with mains power plugs that are removable from the cord (so that different plugs can be used), plugs that are moulded onto the cord, like that of the clubs' MacBook Pros are safe.

Be sure to check this out and get a free replacement if yours is of the type in the program. See the link for details.

Beta versions of future updates are also available for developer testing.

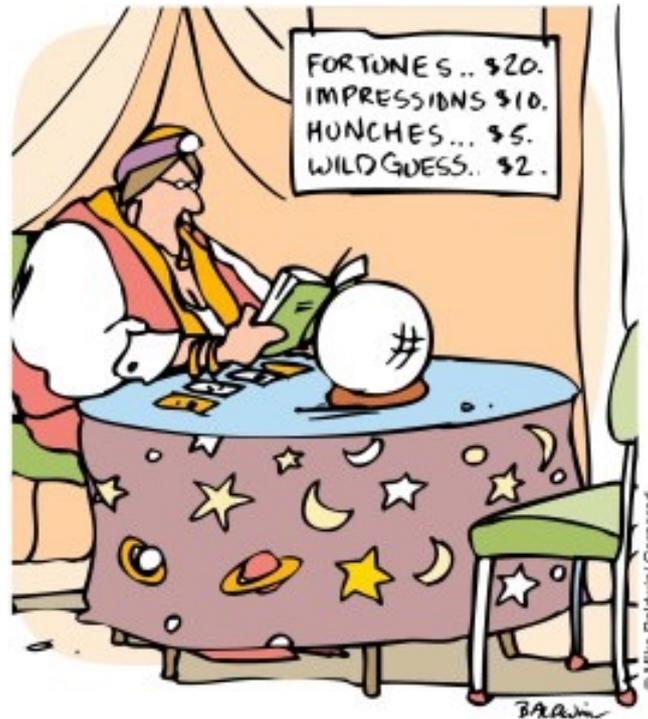

As previously shared, the Skylake chips are Intel’s newest (6th generation Core/iSeries processors) apart from being more efficient and some with improved graphics processors, these chips support Thunderbolt 3. Apple were first with Thunderbolt and Thunderbolt 2 but have yet to embrace the new version, no doubt due to the chip availability.

*I expect new Thunderbolt 3 Mac’s before too long. Thunderbolt 3 changes ports again using USB-Type C connectors the same as USB3.1 as used in the MacBook. I do hope that the number of ports is not reduced though. Thunderbolt 3 is backwards compatible with previous versions, display port and USB but adaptors will be required.*

## Apple R&D Expansion

I have not been able to find updated information about the progress of the Campus2 “Spaceship” building development but did find this below.

It looks like Apple is increasing R&D, perhaps the car?

Hiring car industry experts and engineers has been halted now but according to some there are over 1,000 of them on staff.

Elon Musk of Tesla is convinced about Apples’ intentions due to the aggressive poaching of his engineers and the vast number they have employed “It’s an open secret” he said. (Apple has the cash to buy a car company if it wanted to.)

## 'Yontoo' adware Trojan

I recently installed El Capitan on my early 2008 iMac with the max 4GB RAM. My Mac has performed like a snail ever since but as it had got steadily slower over the last few months, El Capitan may not be the whole problem.

5,000+ old emails were purged from Mail, freeing up over 2GB HDD space and improving Mail performance but not the very long boot-up without opening previously open Apps/files.

I then thought I would disable the Anti-Virus software supplied by Telstra/Bigpond as that runs at start-up.

In the process of investigation (can't remember my password – still trying) I found Yontoo adware installer had been quarantined by it.

This was not on the new El Captan startup disk but saved in backups.

I had not responded to installation requests as described so was not affected but this installer file still found its way onto my Mac, – very sneaky.

Just maybe I should keep the Anti-Virus working but I do need my Mac to start-up and perform as it used to.

Maybe I will have to revert to an older OS X.

A new 27" iMac would also be nice...

**PS:** My Wacom Bamboo drawing tablet (yet to look for a new driver) and Quark Xpress 10.5.2 (newer 2015 version needed at \$385 upgrade price) will not work with El Capitan. It's back to Yosemite for me, fortunately, I have a bootable cloned external HDD.
