Why not be afraid of AI?

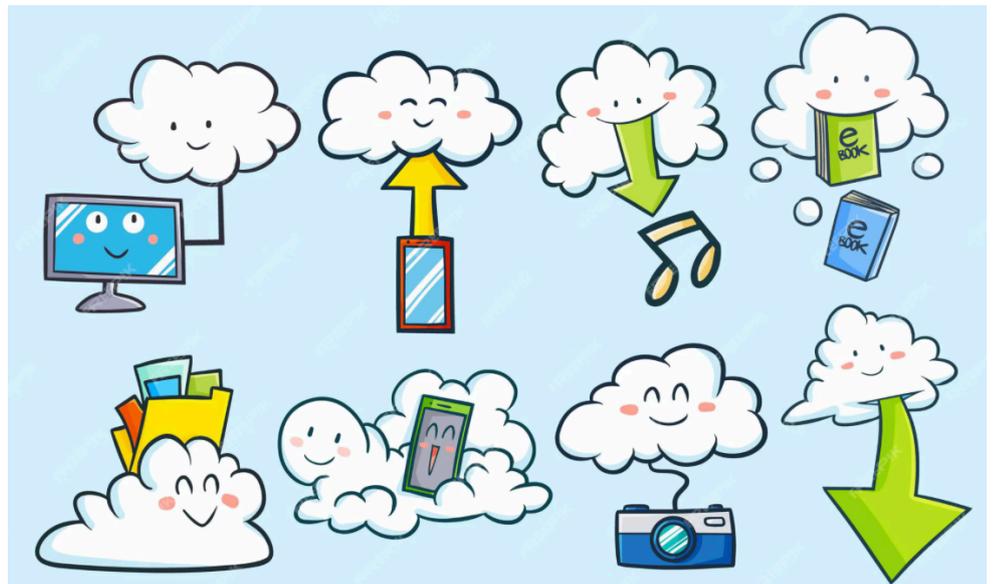
AI is a tool — like a calculator or a car. It's designed to **help**, not replace us. It can make life easier by doing boring or repetitive tasks and letting people focus on more important or creative things.

As long as it's **used responsibly** and with **human guidance**, AI is just a smart helper.

Why not be afraid of iCloud?

iCloud is just a safe place on the internet to **store your photos, files, and backups** — like a digital locker only you can open.

It helps keep your stuff safe if your device is lost or broken, and lets you access it anywhere. Apple also uses strong **privacy and security protections** to keep your data safe.

What is AI?

Apple's online storage service that **automatically saves your photos, files, messages, and backups** in a safe place on the internet.

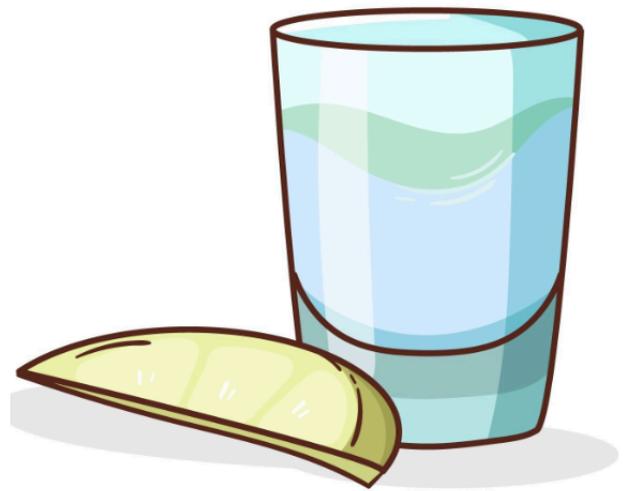

Liquid Glass

Apple's new "Liquid Glass" design language, introduced at WWDC 2025, marks a significant visual overhaul across its operating systems, including iOS 26, iPadOS 26, macOS 26 (Tahoe), watchOS 26, tvOS 26, and visionOS 2. Key Features of Liquid Glass

- **Translucent Interfaces:** UI elements like app icons, widgets, and control panels exhibit a frosted-glass appearance, allowing background colors and movements to subtly influence their look.
- **Dynamic Typography:** On the Lock Screen, the clock adapts its size and position based on the underlying wallpaper, ensuring readability without obstructing the image. [smartprix.com+1apple.com+1](#)
- **Responsive Animations:** Elements respond to user interactions with fluid animations, enhancing the tactile feel of the interface.

iOS 26 Enhancements

- **Home Screen Customisation:** Users can apply depth-aware wallpapers that interact with app icons and widgets, creating a layered visual effect.
- **Control Center Redesign:** The Control Center features semi-transparent backgrounds and rounded controls, aligning with the Liquid Glass aesthetic.

macOS 26 (Tahoe) Updates

- **Dock and Menu Bar:** These elements adopt the translucent, layered look, providing a sense of depth without compromising functionality.

- **Finder and System Apps:** Built-in applications showcase the new design with subtle animations and glass-like textures, enhancing visual coherence .theverge.com+1oakcover.com+1

The Liquid Glass design draws inspiration from Apple's visionOS, aiming to bridge the gap between digital interfaces and physical materials . Top Features of iPadOS 26

Advanced Window Management

- Freely resize, move, and tile app windows.
- Adds Mac-like multitasking to iPad.

Mac-Inspired Tools.

- New **menu bar**, **Preview app**, and improved **Files app**.
- Supports background tasks for better productivity.

Liquid Glass Design

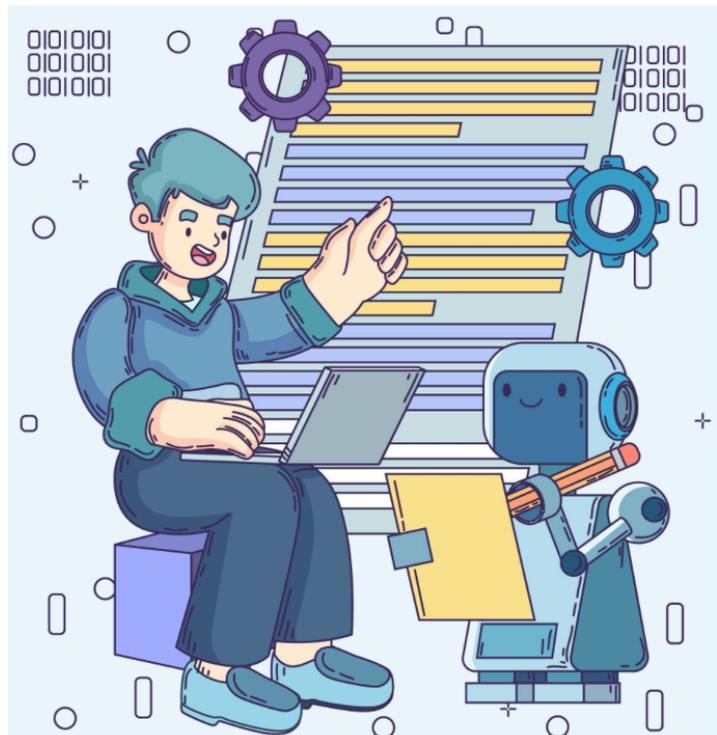
- Translucent, layered UI with smooth animations.
- Dynamic colours that react to your wallpaper and apps.

Apple Intelligence (AI)

- **Live translations**, **Genmoji**, and smart writing/image tools.
- Available on M-series and A17 Pro iPads only.

Pro Audio/Video Tools

- Local recording, voice isolation, and per-app mic selection.
- Great for creators and remote work.



Other Highlights

- New **Apple Music widgets** and **Journal app** with Pencil support.
- Accessibility upgrades, including better Braille support.

Available around September 2025 for most iPads from the 8th generation onward, including iPad Air (3rd+), mini (5th+), and all modern iPad Pros.

Photos in OS26

Tabbed Navigation Returns

- **Library** and **Collections** tabs reintroduced for easier browsing.
- Collections group photos by people, trips, memories, and more — auto-organised by AI.
- Makes navigating large photo libraries faster and more intuitive.

Apple Intelligence Integration

- **Smart Albums:** AI automatically creates albums based on events, moods, or people.
- **Natural Language Search:** Search using phrases like *"photos of me at the beach in 2023."*
- **Memory Movies:** AI generates short movies from selected photos/videos with a storyline and music.

New Clean Up Tool

- Removes unwanted objects from backgrounds (like wires, people, clutter).
- Similar to Google's Magic Eraser — powered by on-device AI.
- Works with just a tap or brush stroke.

Redesigned Interface

- Uses the new **Liquid Glass** look: translucent panels, subtle blur effects, and dynamic colour adaptation.

- Consistent visual design across all Apple devices.

Private Albums Upgrade

- You can now lock Hidden and Recently Deleted albums with Face ID/Touch ID.
- New privacy options for sharing specific photo types or events.

Video Support Enhancements

- Smarter scene recognition and automatic video curation.
- Improved playback for Live Photos and Memories.

Navigation: From Confusion to Clarity

iPadOS 18:

- Introduced a single, unified view that many users found cluttered and less intuitive.

iPadOS 26:

- Reintroduces **tabbed navigation** with distinct **Library** and **Collections** tabs, enhancing user experience by providing clearer organisation and easier access to photo categories.

Design: Flat vs. Liquid Glass

iPadOS 18:

- Featured a flat, minimalistic design with limited depth and texture.

iPadOS 26:

- Adopts the new **Liquid Glass** design language, offering translucent UI elements, dynamic color shifts, and a more immersive visual experience.

Intelligence: Basic Search vs. AI-Powered Features

iPadOS 18:

- Provided basic search functionality based on metadata like dates and locations.

iPadOS 26:

- Integrates **Apple Intelligence**, enabling:
 - **Smart Albums:** Automatically generated albums based on events, people, and moods.
 - **Enhanced Search:** Improved search capabilities that allow users to find specific photos or videos using natural language descriptions.
 - **Memory Movies:** Creation of custom memory movies with selected photos, videos, and music, organised into a narrative arc.

Editing Tools: Limited vs. Advanced

iPadOS 18:

- Offered standard editing tools like cropping, filters, and basic adjustments.

iPadOS 26:

- Introduces the **Clean Up** tool, allowing users to remove unwanted background objects from images with a tap, brush, or circle. en.wikipedia.org

Privacy: Basic vs. Enhanced

iPadOS 18:

- Included basic privacy features like the Hidden album.

iPadOS 26:

- Enhances privacy by allowing users to lock Hidden and Recently Deleted albums with Face ID or Touch ID, and offers new privacy options for sharing specific photo types or events.
